
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A Caring Environment, A Path To Success.

Lighthouse provides its members with the opportunity to increase their social, vocational and educational skills, develop friendships and overcome feelings of isolation. The “Clubhouse” model, which was developed over a half century ago, provides members with a supportive environment where they can get assistance with transitioning into the workplace or back into school as well as increasing their participation in the community. Membership is voluntary and services are designed to meet individual needs.



A Chance to be Productive, Achievement In the Workplace.

Lighthouse provides several specialized units (see center panel) that members use to manage the club’s work as well as to learn and master critical vocational skills. This approach ensures cooperation, inclusion, and shared responsibility. It also allows each member to be productive despite his or her disability. Because of the importance of work to gaining a sense of purpose and self-esteem, work and work related activities are a primary focus at this clubhouse.

Practiced Skills, Productive Employment.

Lighthouse is designed to help members transfer skills and capabilities to real jobs in the community.

Members join a clubhouse because they want to be productive, so the club is structured to provide them with a variety of services that help them succeed. Each member develops an individual rehabilitation plan that identifies training and job placement priorities as well as preferences. Members are also provided with career counseling, interview skills training, resume writing, and job search assistance as needed.



Ongoing Support, Permanent Job.

Once a member is placed in a Transitional or Independent Employment Job, clubhouse staff continues to provide ongoing support for work related and personal issues. For Transitional Employment Jobs, staff will train with the member so they can provide actual job related and skill building support. Employers of Transitional Employed members also benefit from the co-training because the staff person will fill in for the member in the case of an absence. Transitional Employment jobs are generally structured to be temporary. The goal, in most cases, is to allow the member to move on to Independent Employment after a specific period. Members seeking Independent Employment receive support from the club based on their identified goals and needs.
